Now for the final chapter of our Hospitable Housing program [for the Olympics]. Although we didn't have as many Pi Phi Visitors as originally anticipated (due to news reports of huge traffic jams, scalpers' ticket prices, terrorists, boycotts, earthquakes, airline ticket prices, etc.), Hospitable Housing was able to accomplish its original goal of providing gracious, low-cost Bed and Breakfast accommodations for those Pi Phis who requested them. Southern California Pi Phis have proven that the ''ties that bind'' do continue after graduation.

On a more personal basis, my family had the pleasure of hosting a most delightful 3-generation family (2 generations of Pi Phis) during the Olympics. That week confirmed my original contention that if Pi Phis could meet and share common experiences during a brief period of time, new lifelong friends could be made; as well as strengthening the part that Pi Beta Phi plays in our lives.

Although there were 6 additional people in our home during that week, it was never anything but a pleasure. We all had so much in common (including husbands and kids) and yet coming from different parts of the country we had so much to share. As far as I was concerned the time went much too quickly.

Now we find out that the picture, and the two on the inside, were taken by professional photographer Steven Shoemaker of Monmouth, and we are happy to give him credit for his skill. An added plus is the fact that Steven is the son of Jacqueline McGinnes Shoemaker, Illinois Alpha, whose home is also in Monmouth. So, it was sorta all in the family, and that's even nicer.

While we're on the subject of cover pictures, we hope you're particularly thrilled with the cover of this issue. Sometimes it's very difficult to get pictures you desperately want, and you have to enlist the aid of as many friends as possible. Such was true this time and we are particularly grateful to Ruth Killam, Nancy Kemp, Liz Holman, Jeannie Hillis, and any number of others who helped track down pictures and information for us. Thanks, ladies!

Kathy Ebert, Illinois Epsilon, was certainly in the news a lot last summer. Her photo appeared July 4 on the front page of the *New York Times* and in countless other papers across the nation. She was on CBS Evening News, and in the July 16 issue of TIME Magazine.

Kathy was one of three women to testify before a state hearing examiner in 1979 when the Minneapolis and St. Paul Jaycees first filed suit against the national organization, claiming that the by-laws which excluded women from joining were discriminatory.

The case worked its way up through the court system until finally, in July, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that women must be allowed to join.

After the decision, the Minneapolis Jaycees held a press conference at which Kathy spoke, and her comments and photo were picked up by the Associated Press and distributed nationally.

Kathy, her husband Tim Hilger, and their three-year-old daughter Carrie, live in St. Louis Park, Minn. Kathy is a former vice president of the Minneapolis Jaycees.

One of Pi Phi's noted, acclaimed artists is Evalyn Prouty Hickman, Colorado Alpha, of Fort Collins, Colorado. Last summer Evalyn had an exhibition of more than 130 works in the Student Center Gallery at Colorado State, where she is a professor on the art faculty. The huge exhibition, "Southwest Images Revisited," featured the work for which Evalyn has become noted—on handmade paper, etched glass, porcelain and sand painting.

Evalyn said that the show was 'a dream come true . . . it's my life to this point.''

Not only was the amount of work in the exhibit almost beyond belief, but during last year Evalyn also created 1,000 small images on handmade paper for those attending the national convention of Kappa Kappa Gamma last June.

We are the proud owner of two lovely pieces of Evalyn's work, so we can just imagine the impact of the exhibit, as well as the impact on our Kappa friends.

Special honors should go to Cindy Bannasch, Michigan Gamma, a senior at Michigan State. Cindy spent last summer as a senior counselor in a camp for physically and mentally impaired children and adults. Some of the camp residents and counselors, including Cindy, were leaving the pool area when one noticed a body at the bottom. Cindy pulled the 200 pound youth from the pool, lifted him over her head to safety, and administered cardio-pulmonary resuscitation for ten minutes, saving his life.

The young man had suffered a seizure and fallen, fully clothed, into the water.

Cindy has certainly earned "hero" designation!

By the time you receive this issue of The ARROW, Pi Phi will have added one new chapter to the roll and will be counting down to the installation of another. Welcome, New York Epsilon, at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, N.Y., installed the weekend of November 16. Welcome, also, to the recolonized Florida Delta chapter, scheduled to be installed soon after the first of the year.

Congratulations to Julia L. Quackenbush, Ohio Zeta, of Roanoke, Va., who was included in the latest selection of Outstanding Young Women in America for her community accomplishments. Julie serves on the Virginia Zeta Alumnae Advisory Committee.

Interested in some statistics? Grand President Jean Scott notes that, as of June 30, 1984, Pi Beta Phi has recorded 140,084 initiates. Of that number, 86.4% are still living and in good standing. Wouldn't it be marvelous if *all* alumnae in that 86.4% continued to support the Fraternity through their contributions to the Friendship Fund?





Still under development, this \$500 million complex currently includes three levels of boutiques, specialty shops, and restaurants, two major office complexes, two hotels, luxury apartments and condominiums, and a 10-acre landscaped central square for community activities.

Renovations recently completed in the Crown Center retail complex added the Heartland Market, featuring restaurants and specialty shops, and the Crystal Pavilion, a unique glass enclosed restaurant overlooking the square.

Pi Beta Phi at R.P.I.

Founded in 1824, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute is a privately endowed, nonsectarian institution. The oldest engineering and technical institution in the country and the first college to introduce the laboratory method of learning sciences, the institute offers programs in engineering science, architecture, management, humanities, and social sciences. The campus is located on a plateau overlooking the Hudson River in Troy, New York.

Members of the local sorority Kappa Phi at R.P.I. became duly pledged members of Pi Beta Phi on September 4, 1984. This was a special and long awaited day for the charter pledges. Upon Kappa Phi's founding in 1982, eleven members wrote to Pi Phi about national affiliation. The interest emerged from the fact that one member has a Pi Phi sister at the University of Vermont. At that time Pi Phi was fully committed to extension projects and could not consider their request. This did not deter the women from continuing to seek affiliation. They participated as members of the Greek system composed of twentyeight groups for men, and three groups for women. Kappa Phi established a membership of fifty women in only two years and continued their quest for national affiliation in the spring of 1984. After a series of presentations and considerations on the part of both Kappa Phi and Pi Phi, and with a favorable vote of Alpha Province clubs and chapters, Grand Council accepted the petition of Kappa Phi.

The pledging ceremony took place at the home of Margaret Babcock Davis, D.C. Alpha, in Brunswick Hills, N.Y. The ceremony was conducted by Maralou Juday Crane, Director of Extension, assisted by Annette Mitchell Mills, N.P.C. Delegate, Audrey Ludden Gangloff, Alpha Province President, Christa Landgraf, Illinois Theta and Resident Graduate Consultant for the new colony, and the local alumnae. Following the ceremony a reception was hosted by the Albany Alumnae Club, Janice Ullman Stankus, president, and the Schnectady Alumnae Club, Gayle Omer Caufield, president.

The young women were impressed with the events of the evening and left with an enthusiasm for Pi Phi that was exciting to witness. Installation of the New York Epsilon chapter was scheduled for November 16–18, 1984. Sherilyn Faircloth VanOrden, New York Alpha, is serving as general chairman and both clubs are assisting with plans for the installation weekend.

Nancy Hogshead reaches her golden goals



Duke swimming coach Robert Thompson invited the freshman, Nancy Hogshead, into his office for a preseason summit meeting of sorts.

Here was an 18-year-old who had, essentially, reached the denouement of her career. Her resume was complete. At 12, she appeared in the U.S. Nationals, making her the second youngest ever to do so; at 14, she had an American record in the 100-meter butterfly; at 15 and 16, she was ranked #1 in the world in 200-meter butterfly.

Finally, at 18, Nancy made the 1980 Olympic team in two events. She had to stay home because of the western-bloc boycott, but was close enough to the pinnacle. Too close, anyway, to go through it all again.

The only words Thompson had for her, "You are going to be on the 1984 Olympic Team."

Hogshead laughed. "You've got to be kidding. There's no way."

Still, Nancy worked hard for Thompson. She was an All-American in two events her freshman season, set 11 school records that still stand and two conference records.

Soon after, tired and burned out, Nancy quit swimming, supposedly for good. For close to a year and a half, she didn't swim another race. "I had to get away from swimming to look back on it and see what went wrong. I had good insight. I was so wrapped up in it that I couldn't look at it objectively. It was such an emotional thing."

From swimming often for Duke and occasionally in international meets, Nancy now did not think about swimming at all.

Somewhere along the line, of course her thoughts changed. The three gold medals and one silver the North Carolina Beta Pi Phi won in Los Angeles fell one short of the Olympic record for most swimming medals by one woman. These rewards have made up for the travail of intervening years, in which Hogshead quit the sport for 16 months, came back to train hard, lived away from home for 18 months, survived a change in coaches, a change in events, and sought help from a sports psychologist.

Begins Olympic training

On New Years Day, 1983, Nancy Hogshead began 18 months of training for the 1984 Olympic Games. Swimming again had become the focal point of her existance in her decision to leave Duke to train with Randy Reese, her former coach, at the University of Florida.

However in September of that year, Nancy decided she wasn't getting the kind of attention she needed with Reese. After some searching, she found Mitch Ivey, coach at the Concord-Pleasant Hills program outside San Francisco. She and a good friend, Duke graduate Mandy Calder, drove to California.

With Ivey, Nancy found just what she wanted. His first idea was to change her events. Looking at the makeup of the probable 1984 U.S. Team, it seemed Nancy would have a better chance in the sprints, namely the 100-meter freestyle.

Hogshead described a typical training day with Ivey:

"Wake up in the morning, eat a lot. Work out for $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours, come home and eat some more. Sleep, get up, light snack. Then there'd be an afternoon workout for $3\frac{1}{2}-4$ hours. Went home, ate, and went to bed."

For ten months!!!

"I was so tired every evening after practice," Nancy said, "I couldn't even go see a movie.

"He was so very intense. Everything we did was all business. He was very positive: 'you're doing good, Nancy, Put your legs into this.' He was tireless. He worked as hard as I did.'"

The stress became great about three months before the Olympics were to begin, with trials looming in June. To cope with the strain, and to help with relaxation and concentration, Nancy solicited the services of Dr. Thomas Tutko, sports psychologist, just following the Nationals.

"I knew I had to do something," she said, "because I was getting real nervous before meets. I knew I was swimming fast but I could have gone faster if I hadn't been so nervous."

Nancy's work with Dr. Tutko and Reese paid off when she successfully qualified for four events on the 1984 U.S. Olympic swim team.

But imagine the feelings Nancy had on July 29, 1984, standing over her lane before the 100-meter freestyle of the Olympic Games. Twenty-two years, about to be compressed into one minute.

Emotional Moment

Nancy didn't know that she would be on her way to Olympic stardom by capturing not only this medal, but four—three gold and one silver.

"Receiving my gold medal on the victory stand was the most exciting moment of my life. It meant so much just to be there. It was a day and a moment I had thought about every day for years. All the work since coming back from retirement was worthwhile. The crowd was so supportive and I was proud to be a part of the U.S. Team. Then I really choked up when the band played *The Star Spangled Banner* and they raised the American flag. It sounds trite but it was very real.

"The medal itself is about three inches in diameter and very heavy. I think it is silver with a gold covering. The ribbon colors are the same used around all the Olympic themes . . . shades of green, gold, orange, pink, and blue. The engraving on the medal is very heavy.

"I have had lots of questions about my plans for the future. Let me say that there are so many things I have missed parties, football games, friends, but especially my Pi Phi sisters who have supported me through the past 18 months with their cards, letters, flowers, and prayers," said Nancy. "Honestly I am looking forward to my retirement now that I have fulfilled my swimming goals. I will be able to spend my last semesters at Duke enjoying a normal college life."

Nancy thrilled the entired Duke University campus with her incredible feats. The Olympic spirit followed her back to Duke this fall. Upon her return, she was greeted by a congratulatory banner made by the 1984 Pi Beta Phi pledge class. Nancy, in return, thrilled the entire chapter by bringing one of her three gold medals to the first chapter meeting. The North Carolina Beta Pi Phis are certainly proud of their golden Olympic sister!

Morgan wins spot in Olympic Band

Senior Carole Morgan, Missouri Alpha, was selected as a member of the All-American Olympic Band. The organization performed at the 1984 Summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Carole was the only Pi Phi selected for the honor.


Selection was based on playing ability, musical accomplishments, leadership qualities, and contribution to the university. Carole holds the first chair positions in both Marching Mizzou and the Tiger Band. She is also a member of the Mini-Mizzou basketball band, the symphony band, French horn ensemble, and the Brass Quintet, at the University of Missouri.

The Olympic Band was the largest marching band ever assembled and represented all 50 states. Out of 736 members, only 230 were not from California.

In preparation for the ceremonies, band members rehearsed 14 hours a day. They spent their first two weeks at Pepperdine University in Malibu and the final two weeks at Loyola University in Los Angeles. The band performed at opening and closing ceremonies and at Olympic baseball games. Out-of-state members performed at Disneyland, Magic Mountain, and Sea World in San Diego.

Tracie's routines earn raves, medals

When her idol has been Esther Williams, star of those earlier water ballet movies, it's



easy to see where Tracie Ruiz, Arizona Alpha, has received her inspiration. It's called synchronized swimming now, and it made its debut in the 1984 Los Angeles Games. It has been a part of the world championships since 1973. However, the International Olympic Committee didn't decide to sanction it as an Olympic event till 1980. Tracie is the reigning world champ, unbeaten in solo competition in the last five years.

Tracie has been called "the most complete synchronized swimmer in the world." Other raves included "no one can dispute, she's the finest synchronized swimmer in the world today." She proved her advance notices by winning two gold medals—one in solo, and, with her partner Candy Costie, one in duet.

In the solo competition, a performer displays synchronization with music. Emphasis is on difficulty of moves, creativity, originality, and interpretation of the music. Tracie's routine earned 198.467 points, almost three points higher than the silver medalist. Scoring is done by a panel of judges who judge compulsory figures, accounting for 50% of the total score, and routines performed to music. In the duet, two swimmers perform mirror-like images in the water, staying synchronized with each other as well as with the music. Tracie and Candy were the unquestionable favorites in this competition. They lived up to their reputation by winning the first Olympic medal awarded in the category.

The capacity crowd at the Olympic swim stadium responded to the intricate routines with noisy enthusiasm. The duo were unquestionable favorites—Tracie's fluidity complemented by Candy's flamboyance. Almost as soon as they submerged in the pool the crowd responded.

With a dash of patriotic music, the young women earned a 99.0 score from the ten judges in the routine competition. In compulsory competition, they received 96.584, for a combined score of 195.584.


Tracie and Candy are both former performers at the University of Arizona in Tucson. The girls have been performing as partners for the past ten years. They left the University after completing one year to train for the 1984 Olympics. Their workouts consisted of six to eight long, hard hours of swimming, running, weight-lifting, and practice every day.

Tracie pledged Pi Phi in the fall of 1981, and was initiated in February, 1982. Her home is in Bothell, Washington.

Craftsman is grateful

An experience last fall illustrates the need Pi Phi still meets in the Gatlinburg community. A local craftsman, who sells a lot of his work to the Arrowcraft Shop, talked to us in November about buying things from him through the winter instead of waiting until the spring. He had produced a large order which was cancelled just before delivery. He had a finished inventory of goods, raw materials to pay for, and wages for himself and two helpers—all dependent on this one order.

We went to his studio and looked at the items he had and also new styles we could buy, since we couldn't use all the things from the cancelled order. We agreed to purchase some of the finished goods and contracted to have him make us new things and to pay for them monthly during the winter. This arrangement gave him money to pay his bills, take care of his family, and keep his two helpers employed.

He expressed his gratitude to Arrowcraft and the Fraternity when he said, "If it weren't for the Pi Phis, I couldn't have made it through the winter."

Spring classes offered

Prior to 1980 classes at Arrowmont were held mainly during the summer. Many inquiries were received expressing an interest in having classes scheduled at other times of the year.

Arrowmont now offers classes during March. These one week classes are similar to those offered during the summer with fiber, fabric, metal, clay, wood, and stained glass being taught. Students with little or no background as well as those who have developed to a professional level are welcomed. For university enrolled students, the one week sessions usually fall within spring break, thus allowing the opportunity for additional credit, an experience in a new medium, or a change from a routine academic involvement.

During the summer he took a watercolor painting class taught by Marcia Goldenstein.

Robert found facilities at Arrowmont to be exceptional and the natural beauty of its scenic location in the Smoky Mountains to be inspirational. He stated that intangible elements, such as the fellowship and camaraderie that develop, made the experience of taking a class at Arrowmont a unique and rewarding one.

The first recipient of a one week Arrowmont scholarship, offered by the Canadian Philanthropic Committee-Alberta Club, was Laurelle Lawson, a Pi Phi in her third year at the University of Alberta. The scholarship covered travel expenses, tuition, and room and board for one week and enabled Laurelle to participate in a two week woven wearables workshop taught by Sharon Lumsden.

The workshop was a productive one for Laurelle. As a beginning student in weaving she learned the basic techniqes and constructed four different articles of clothing, as well as additional cloth which she swapped for a ceramics piece made by a pottery student. Laurelle also took home knowledge in many different media, acquired as she observed other classes in progress. She was impressed by the varied backgrounds of students and that people came from all over the country to attend classes at Arrowmont.

Laurelle made many new friendships at Arrowmont and she plans to keep in touch with several of her fellow students to exchange ideas and report on progress. She considered her scholarship to be an awareness experience, expressing a desire to share her feelings about Arrowmont with other Alberta Pi Phis. She hopes to encourage others to see this philanthropic project in person to help realize the benefit provided to many through Arrowmont School.

Laurelle plans to continue with her newly acquired weaving skills by obtaining her own loom and to continue her pursuit of a career in clothing and textile merchandising.

Pi Phi alums attend summer classes

During the eleven weeks of mixed media classes offered at Arrowmont last summer, several Pi Phi alumnae were among the students participating in classes.

Michelle Feulner, Tennessee Gamma alumna, was at Arrowmont for six weeks on an assistantship. As an assistant Michelle had various duties, from making signs, installing exhibitions, studio assistance, and locking up buildings at night, to helping with transportation of students to/from the airport. She was involved in four weeks of classes in graphic arts, figure drawing, and mixed media on cloth. The opportunity to take classes at Arrowmont allowed Michelle to explore ideas and expand technical knowledge with her art work and to move into different media and directions with new art pieces.

Michelle lives in Lafayette, Ind., where she is an artist in printmaking, drawing, and painting. She describes her art work as dealing with "entrapment by political and social devices." Figures are used to evoke a reaction from the viewer by drawing them into the perspective of the figures in each piece.

Another Pi Phi alumna at Arrowmont was Ann Struble Norris, a member of the Charlotte (NC) Alumnae Club and an Iowa State Pi Phi. Ann participated in a two week class in wax resist dyeing taught by Ed Lambert. Ann has been to Arrowmont during five previous years for classes and attributes her present success and direction in art to these classes.

Her current work involves designing and producing jackets using silk dyeing, quilting, and applique techniques with emphasis on three dimensional aspects. This is accomplished through embellishment by crocheting, macrame, and manipulation of the cloth.

Ann feels that Arrowmont is on the "leading edge of the arts and crafts movement" and that she receives inspiration and motivation each time she comes. The atmosphere and interaction with other people in the visual arts are positive elements that draw people like Ann back to Arrowmont.

Karen Lewis, a Pi Phi at U.C.L.A. and now a member of the Westchester County (N.Y.) Alumnae Club, was at Arrowmont during the summer sessions for a sgraffito ceramic course. This was Karen's first time at Arrowmont and she found it to be a 'wonderful experience.'' A painter and printmaker, Karen has taught high school art for eleven years. Technical knowledge acquired at Arrowmont will be used to assist her in teaching.

Part of Karen's tuition and costs were paid through a scholarship offered by her alumnae club. Most recipients are local New York artists who are granted the scholarships with the intention that they will return to the community to use and share knowledge gained through Arrowmont. Karen feels it is very important that more Pi Phis apply for scholarships or attend classes at their own expense in order to experience actual daily activities at Arrowmont and to appreciate the value and wide-reaching effects of this philanthropy.

The letterhead is from Newsweek magazine, but it would be a fallacy to think that her contributing editorship of that magazine were her only activity. For Jane Bryant Quinn, Vermont Alpha, her Newsweek activities are only the beginning of a long list of positions and achievements.

The name is familiar to thousands of readers of *Woman's Day* because of Jane's informative "Money Facts" page in each issue. For four years, until July of this year, she contributed at least two spots per week to CBS Morning News, and in July, moved from the morning news to CBS Evening News. She's the author of *Everyone's Money Book*, published in 1979, with a second edition in 1980.

Jane Bryant Quinn is a journalist in the best sense of the word. And she is busy probably the country's busiest freelance financial commentator. She is constantly on the go, moving from her various offices and studios in New York, to making frequent trips to Washington, D.C., to fulfilling speaking engagements around the country. Add the responsibilities of a family, and you have a woman with very little time for socializing, a fact that only slightly disgruntles her attorney husband, David.

Middlebury Graduate

Jane was graduated from Middlebury College in Vermont, Magna Cum Laude, in 1960, and has been in journalism ever since. She started out in *Newsweek*'s mail department, switched to *Look* magazine after six months, where she eventually became co-editor of "The Insider's Newsletter." It was during that time that Jane gravitated toward consumer finance pieces.

"There were opportunities for women," notes Jane. "They were just in an area that no one else wanted."

McGraw-Hill was the next rung up the ladder, in 1968. There she founded the "Business Week Letter," but the company's wariness about female editors made them list Jane as J. B. Quinn. She went along with this on the condition that all other newsletter staffers sign off with their initials.

In 1974 Jane struck out on her own as a freelance writer. Her first client was the

Washington Post, followed quickly by Woman's Day, Newsweek, and her television career as a finance reporter.

When her busy professional day is over, Jane returns to the home she and David built in the woods in New York's Westchester County. Report from a Pi Pbi sister

Anorexia nervosa and bulimiadangerous eating disorders


Karen Carpenter was on the road to recovery when she suffered a fatal heart attack at age 32. The untimely death of this beloved singer brought to national attention the fact that anorexia nervosa and bulimia are indeed life-threatening illnesses which have reached epidemic proportions and affect every facet of our society. Eating disorders can cause serious life long physical and psychological problems in the self starver and in those of normal weight who compulsively binge and purge. An estimated six percent die.

Growing up in a society where "thin is in" and success is measured by the size of one's jeans is a struggle for teenagers and young women today. The college woman is faced with added pressures as she confronts the new challenges of living away from home for the first time, being responsible for setting her own limits, striving to excel both socially and academically, planning her career, dealing with her sexuality, and facing periods of fear, isolation, and loneliness.

Family, school, and peer pressures coupled with the mass media's portrayal of the desirable, happy, successful woman as thin often leads a young woman to the conclusion that if she loses "just a few pounds" she, too, will be desirable, happy, and successful. Sometimes, when losing a few pounds does not lead to instant contentment, she tries losing a few more, and a few more. The diet is out of control and the dieter becomes anorexic. The anorexic typically develops an exaggerated interest in food, yet at the same time, denies hunger and refuses to eat. She develops a distorted body image and perceives herself as fat even as the weight loss continues to lifethreatening levels. Sleep problems may develop, and frequently anorexics undertake an unrelenting, strenuous exercise program. She may show unusual devotion to school work. Menstrual periods may cease due to insufficient hormone production brought on by reduced body fat.

Bulimia is characterized by binge eating followed by selfinduced vomiting or laxative abuse. It is estimated that 25 to 30 percent of all college age women have experienced this dangerous binge/purge syndrome. Many bulimics feel controlled by this compulsive cycle which begins with anxiety:

On the surface, the desire to be thin may appear to be the cause of eating disorders. But FOOD IS NOT THE ISSUE! At issue are underlying fears, doubts and insecurities which the anorexic/bulimic must face if she is to overcome these devastating illnesses. Eating disorders tend to strike women who are perfectionists, high achievers, sensitive and self-conscious, and may have low self-esteem. Often they feel they have no control over their lives, so they attempt to gain power by controlling their bodies and eating habits. Because the true underlying feelings are not being confronted, eating disorders lead to depression, withdrawal, feelings of guilt, and a sense of hope-

lessness. Most anorexics/bulimics are young women between the ages of 12 and 25, but a distressing increase is evident in children between the ages of eight and eleven as well as older women. Male cases are being reported with increasing frequency.

Along with the serious psychological scars which can be brought on by eating disorders, a number of physical problems may also appear. These problems include skin dryness, edema, bloating and abdominal pain from laxative abuse, problems with teeth and cavities, salivary gland infection, and amenhorrhea (loss of menstrual period).

There is hope! With proper medical and psychological care, the anorexic/bulimic can overcome her eating disorder and become a healthy, productive member of her community. And there is ANAD—The National Association of Anorexia Nervosa and Associated Disorders.

Personal Experience

I came to ANAD with the hope of making a difference in the lives of people with eating disorders. I truly do understand these illnesses as I began recovering from bulimia three years ago. Being a perfectionist who is very sensitive and bright, I needed a way to control my life even more. I was not overweight and not thin, but an average weight. This was not good enough. I began dieting at age 13 with my sister. I thought I had found a way to have my cake and eat it too. I thought I was in "control," but the bulimia began controlling me. I was trapped in the vicious cycle of bingeing/purging/feeling guilty/and dieting only to escape my fears through bingeing

again. I knew I needed help, but I had no idea that other people had the problem. I became more tired, regimented, and guilty. My complexion was no longer good, my hair lost its luster, and I never had a normal menstrual cycle. It became harder and harder to hide my binges as they became larger and longer.

My recovery began when I told my parents that I needed help. Since my father is a recovering alcoholic, I knew they would have to understand this illness too. I began to see a therapist in conjunction with a support group. My family went to therapy too at times. I *wanted* to recover. I had too much to give this life, and I could not do it with a cloud of an eating disorder over my head.

Help is available

ANAD is the first national non-profit educational and selfhelp organization in North America dedicated to alleviating the problems of anorexia nervosa and bulimia. Through ANAD's efforts, millions of people have been made aware of the dangers and warning signs of anorexia nervosa and bulimia. Each year thousands of anorexics, bulimics and family members turn to ANAD for counsel, assistance, and information. ANAD maintains a referral list of therapists and medical professionals nationwide experienced in treating eating disorders. Self-help support groups have been established in over 40 states and Canada where anorexics, bulimics and their families can meet and share with others suffering from these devastating syndromes. ANAD provides information, early detection, and educational programs to schools, universities, health and civic organizations from coast to coast. All ANAD services are free of charge.

ANAD was founded in 1976 by Vivian Meehan, President, with the dream of assisting sufferers and preventing eating disorders. I had the rewarding experience of being an intern at ANAD the summer of 1982 when I was a junior at Albion College, a Michigan Delta sister. I learned a great deal about the destructive effects of anorexia/bulimia and decided to begin my own support group for the campus community. My Pi Phi sisters at Michigan Delta were very supportive as I made presentations to many sororities and organizations on Albion's campus. Two years later, I came to work for ANAD to be their administrator. It is a challenging, rewarding, and exciting position.

Each day, I answer hot line calls from victims and families across the United States and Canada. Working with recovering anorexics and bulimics in a support group is very fulfilling as well. I am always learning more about these problems and those who are affected by them.

Accepts self

My experience as an ANAD intern really made me realize that I needed to confront and understand some of my underlying feelings of fear, anxiety, anger, and self-esteem. I began to accept myself for who I am instead of trying to please everyone else in my life. I am letting go of the problems in my life over which I have no control. I am much healthier now, both physically and psychologically. Life is so much more meaningful without the obsessions of food, dieting, and control.

"Ocean to ocean there's lasting devotion in the hearts that are bound by the wine and silver blue. Whatever may bind you there's Pi Beta Phi beside you, holding their hands to you." ANAD holds its hands to you and your sisters. ANAD is building a preventative program for young people in their teens. Funding is necessary, so think of ideas that could help your future sisters, our young teens of today. If your sisters need help, hold out your hand with love and concern. Country dance expert teaches mini-series stars

When Martha and George Washington and Sally and George Fairfax whirled through the dance called "Hunt the Squirrel," they did so under the watchful eye of Barbara Hicks Harding, Ohio Delta.

Last April CBS presented an eight-hour mini-series, "George Washington," and Barbara was asked to teach Barry Bostwick, Jaclyn Smith, Patty Duke Astin and David Dukes the intricacies of 1776 country dances. The series was filmed in Alexandria, Va. and the Smithsonian Institution recommended that Barbara be contacted to provide dancers for the series.

Barbara lives in Herndon, Va., and she has been dancing, performing, studying, and teaching country dancing, especially English country dancing, since 1950. In 1975 she began studying researched dances that had been collected as having been performed in 1776.

"I formed a class of dancers interested in exploring these dances," she writes. "We performed at Herndon's Bicentennial Ball, and kept right on performing, as we found this a delight.

"We became the Old Dominion Dancers, and have been invited to perform at historic sites in the D.C. and northern Virginia area, including Woodlawn Plantation, Renwick Gallery, Lee Mansion, Gadsby's Tavern in Old Town Alexandria, and others." Barbara earned a Bachelor's degree in elementary education at American University, after transferring from Ohio Wesleyan during her sophomore year. She is a kindergarten teacher and president of Harding Hall Day Care Center in Herndon. Her special interest, in addition to English country dancing, is English ritual dancing, and she teaches and directs a group of 5th and 6th grade boys who perform ancient ritual sword dances.

Girl Scouts, churches, and other community organizations benefit from Barbara's talent as she donates her dance teaching services for such special activities. In November and early December, she invites children from all churches to assemble for rehearsal in her home, and they prepare and present a program of Christmas folk music and carols. Children from kindergarten through 6th grade participate, and the chorus numbers from 40 to 70 voices. This has been an annual event for nearly twenty years.

Barbara is a regular member of the faculty of Christmas Country Dance School at Berea College in Kentucky, and is there every Christmas season. Early last January she taught a course in country dancing to a double Elderhostel at Berea. During the 1981–82 school year at Berea, she directed the Country Dancers, a team of 60 selected dancers who performed throughout the state of Kentucky, and neighboring states, as a means of introducing the public to Berea College.

Barbara has always had a deep interest in children. "I have a firm feeling about the rights of children and work to see that they have proper opportunities for education.

"Keeping ritual dancing alive is my approach to history and I find it fascinating. Country dancing is one of my favorite activities," she says. Would Barbara encourage others to go into the teaching

Would Barbara encourage others to go into the teaching field?

"Immerse yourself in activities involving children in a learning situation," she advises. "If this has any meaning for you, go into education. DO NOT expect to make a 'cool million'."

But do expect great satisfaction. Barbara Harding has found that satisfaction in her teaching.

Calligraphy expert is internationally known

How does one segue from being a scuba diving instructor to being nationally recognized in the fields of calligraphy and italic handwriting? Well, if you are Denys Richardson Taipale, Washington Alpha, of Great Falls, Mont., you have an interesting story to tell.

Denys has always loved the water, and several years ago, she was a scuba instructor for the military in Okinawa. She had 650 open ocean dives teaching and working with dangerous marine life under a government grant. One day a new student signed up using a beautiful style of writing on his application. When Denys asked about it, she became interested and from that beginning grew the hobby that has become her career.

Denys has an international reputation as a calligrapher, instructor of calligraphy and its related areas, is a consultant on italic handwriting, and is the author of a series of books.

After her introduction to calligraphy, she worked on her own for three years, then spent the next eleven traveling around the world to study the art with masters here and abroad. She doesn't recommend self-study as a way to begin, however.

"I had to unlearn a lot of bad habits. Find a qualified teacher," she urges. "There are calligraphy societies everywhere, and they list teachers."

As a calligraphy instructor, Denys works with approximately twenty groups a year, running three day to ten day workshops for the beginner through the more experienced. These workshops cover letterforms, layout, design, color, and reproduction. She recently finished a six day workshop with two other calligraphers at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, and that workshop will be repeated in Montana in 1986.

Denys says she is a "tough teacher," demanding two hours of homework a night from students during workshops. She uses humor and enthusiasm and usually leaves her students with a year's worth of material to work on. In her own work she is especially lauded for her swash capitals, the fancy capital letters that go with italic calligraphy. She has been featured at many calligraphy gatherings nationally, and has been guest speaker for the Society for Italic Handwriting in London.

Not only is Denys a former scuba diving instructor, but she is a veteran ski patrol member, a sailor, antique collector, mother of two sons, both in early 20s, and world traveler. As the latter, she averages 100,000 miles per year to teach and run seminars.

That's another side to her personality—flying frightens her, so she sleeps and avoids any conversations on a plane. She has a way of handling garrulous seatmates.

"When they ask what I do for a living," she laughs, "I tell them I'm a nuclear physicist. That shuts them up."

So Denys Taipale continues her travels. She is always booked far in advance. In her hometown of Great Falls, there has been so much exposure to the art form that the school system has formally adopted the teaching of italic handwriting into its curriculum. Denys wrote the materials and teaches teachers how to present it.

When speaking on working together as a team, Julie offers four points. "Be aware of how what you do affects others," Be yourself," "Be involved," and "Take time to think."

Dr. Forker enjoys work on U.S. Olympic Committee

(The following story about Pi Phi's special initiate at the Minneapolis Convention in 1977, Dr. Barbara Forker, Minnesota Alpha, appeared in a recent issue of the iowa stater.)

Barbara Forker is one of many Iowa Staters who were involved in the 1984 Summer Olympic Games. . . .

Forker, Distinguished Professor of Education and head of the department of physical education, is a member of the executive committee of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC).

A sports enthusiast, Forker has taken a keen interest in U.S. participation in the Olympics since 1975 when she served on the President's Commission on Olympic Sports. She is proud of the part she and that commission played in the reorganization of amateur athletics in this country.

"The primary reason for the appointment of the commission by President Ford was to determine what factors impede or tend to impede the United States from fielding its best teams in international competition. Organizational conflicts created a fragmentation among amateur athletic organizations which in turn imposed undue pressure on the individual athlete," Forker explained. Following a year-and-a-half study, the commission's recommendations were used by Congress to form the Amateur Sports Act of 1978.

"As a result of my work on the commission I was asked to serve as a representative to the delegate assembly of the USOC," she said. The group meets annually to elect USOC officers and to enact, amend or repeal provisions of the USOC Constitution.

Currently Forker serves on the executive board. "We handle the main business affairs of the USOC, carry out the purposes and goals, and determine policy," Forker explained. The board meets five or six times during the year at different locations about the country.

"I do enjoy my work with the USOC," Barbara said. "The concepts I deal with and believe in so strongly are also a part of my work in physical education and leisure studies," she said.

In addition to her many other honors, Barbara received the Virgil S. Lagomarcino Laureate Award, in June, presented by the Iowa State College of Education for prestigious service, educational leadership, and personal commitment to education and to the profession of teaching.

My "Capital" experience

Like many Duke students approaching their senior year, I chose to spend my last college summer as an intern in Washington, D.C. This decision is a popular one for students around the country, and rightly so, since the work experience gained is practical, useful, and valuable for a student's career. Spending the summer at a trial job gives many undergraduates the chance to test the job market, see what opportunities exist, establish a network of contacts, and narrow their professional interests. But, in addition, there is lots of fun to be had in the nation's Capital while one is testing out one's independence in the world beyond college.

My internship was conducted in conjunction with American University's Washington Semester Program. In addition to my full time job I went to class every Thursday evening with eleven other students to discuss our job experiences. Each student contributed different opinions on the topics we discussed, such as power within the organization, the organization's method of dealing with outside agencies, and our unique frustrations with the job.

After four interviews I chose the Public Affairs office at the National Museum of American History, one of the Smithsonian Museums. This position combined my dual interests in museum administration, specifically public relations, and American history and political science, my majors at Duke.

My personal project was handling most of the film crews that came into the Museum. My first day on the job proved to be one of the most exciting. Ginger Rogers was to appear for a press conference to donate the dress she wore in *Top Hat* to the Museum. The event was a prime example of a publicity stunt, an essential ingredient to keep the Museum in the public eye. All major Washington newspapers, TV programs, and interested magazines were present, creating an atmosphere of a small scale Presidential press conference! Other interns and I were right in the middle of the action, directing the press, helping them set up their equipment, and making sure the schedule of events ran smoothly. Our efforts were rewarded both with a close-up glimpse of Miss Rogers and a repeat of the day's performance on evening news and in papers.

Washington is a city so full of history, culture, beauty, and action that one cannot appreciate it all in just a short two months. But in that time I became well acquainted with the area; it had become a second home. My internship proved to be a catalyst for my career: the field of museum administration sparked my interest and I have investigated the opportunities for graduate work. Museums house our nation's most treasured history and art collections. What better location than our nation's Capital to spend a summer, and what better organization than the American History branch of the highly regarded Smithsonian Institution.


